- “And God said” ... “and it was so”.

- [Man](#) made in God’s image – [Ge 1.26-27, 5.1-3, 9.6, Col 3.10](#).
- Six days of creation – what does it mean?
 - Literal 24 hour day? Evening and morning. What about the 7th day?

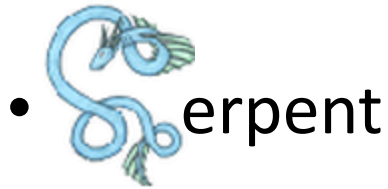

 - Care for the garden

 - Pleasure and food
 - Free choice: Life everlasting **OR** knowledge of good and evil (death)
 - Have dominion and stewardship
 - Fellowship with God
 - Created perfect but on probation
 - The Test – all but one tree
 - A help suitable for Adam not found
 - Not good for man to be alone. The woman made from man
 - Marriage ordained – two become one flesh to be fruitful and multiply

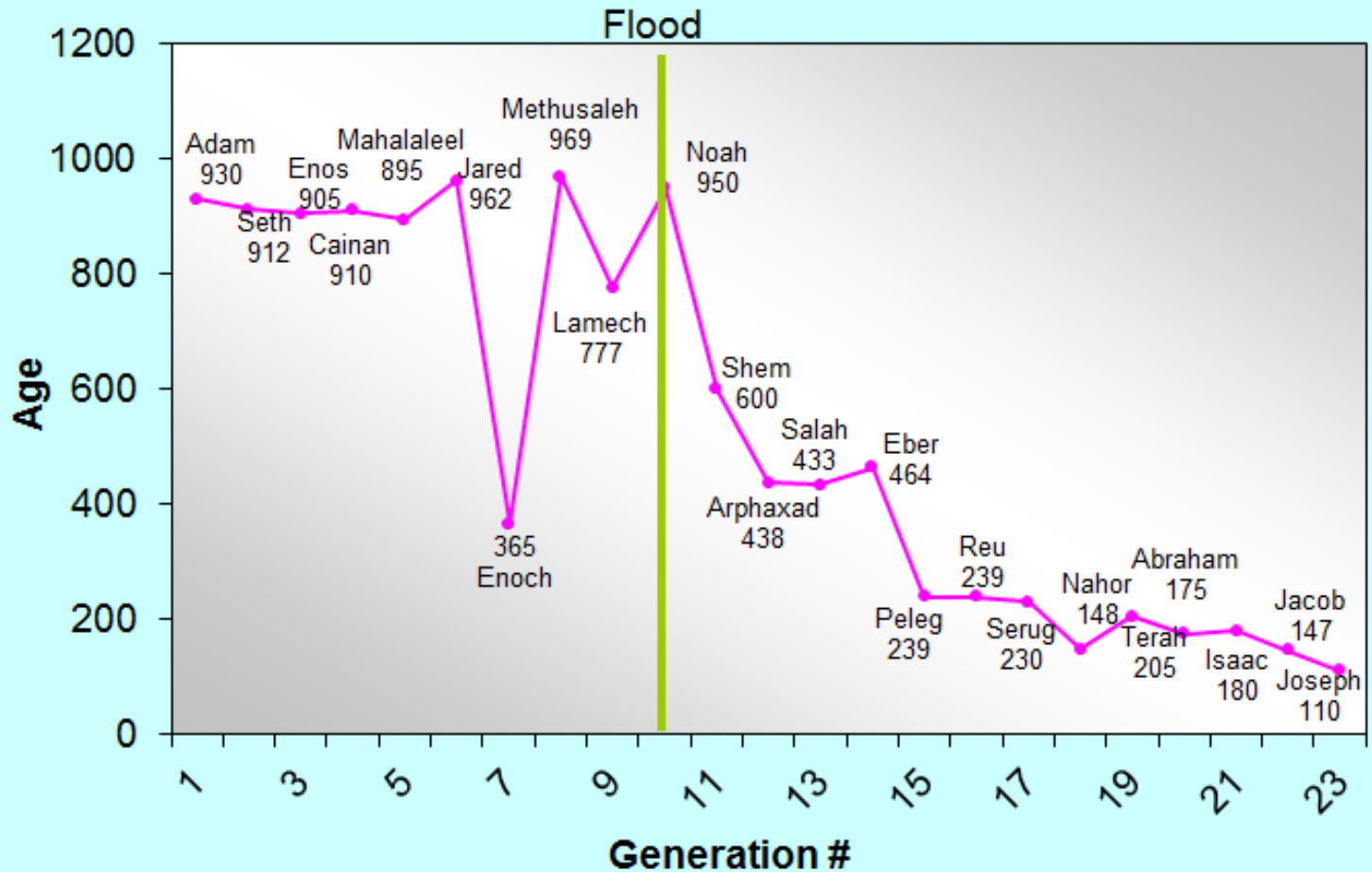

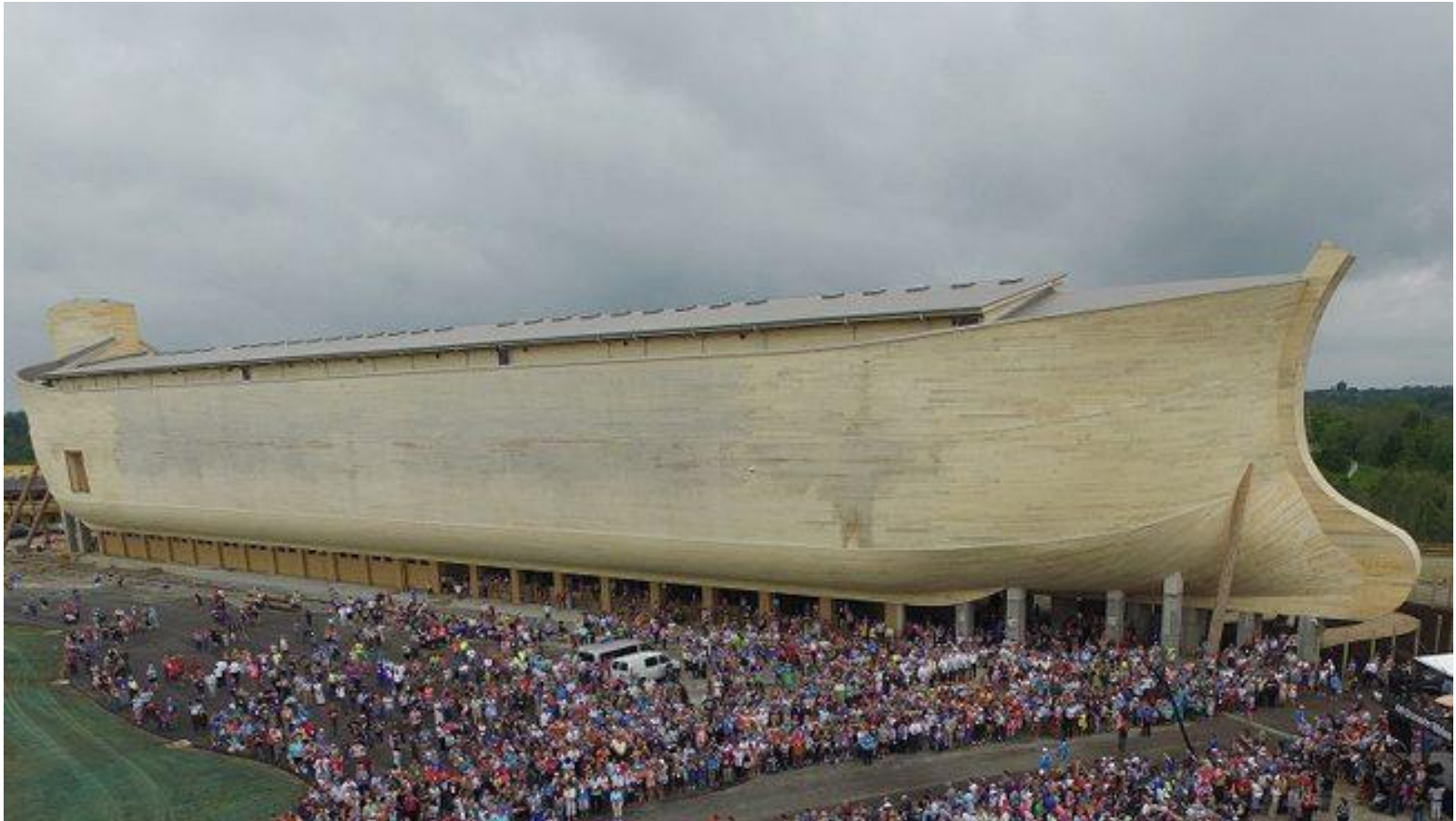
Cause of the Flood

The Flood

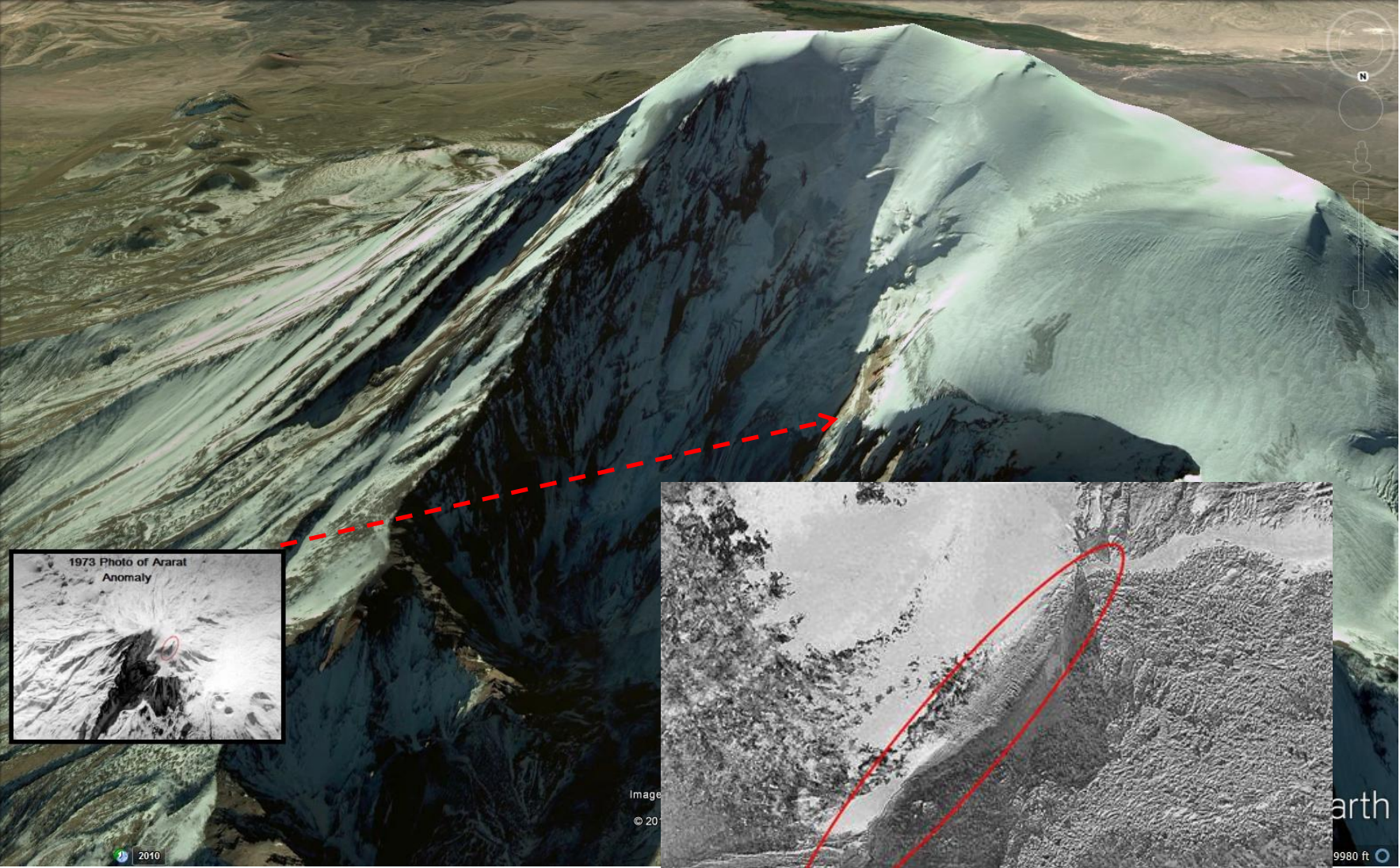
- Rain (1st time?) - windows of heaven opened

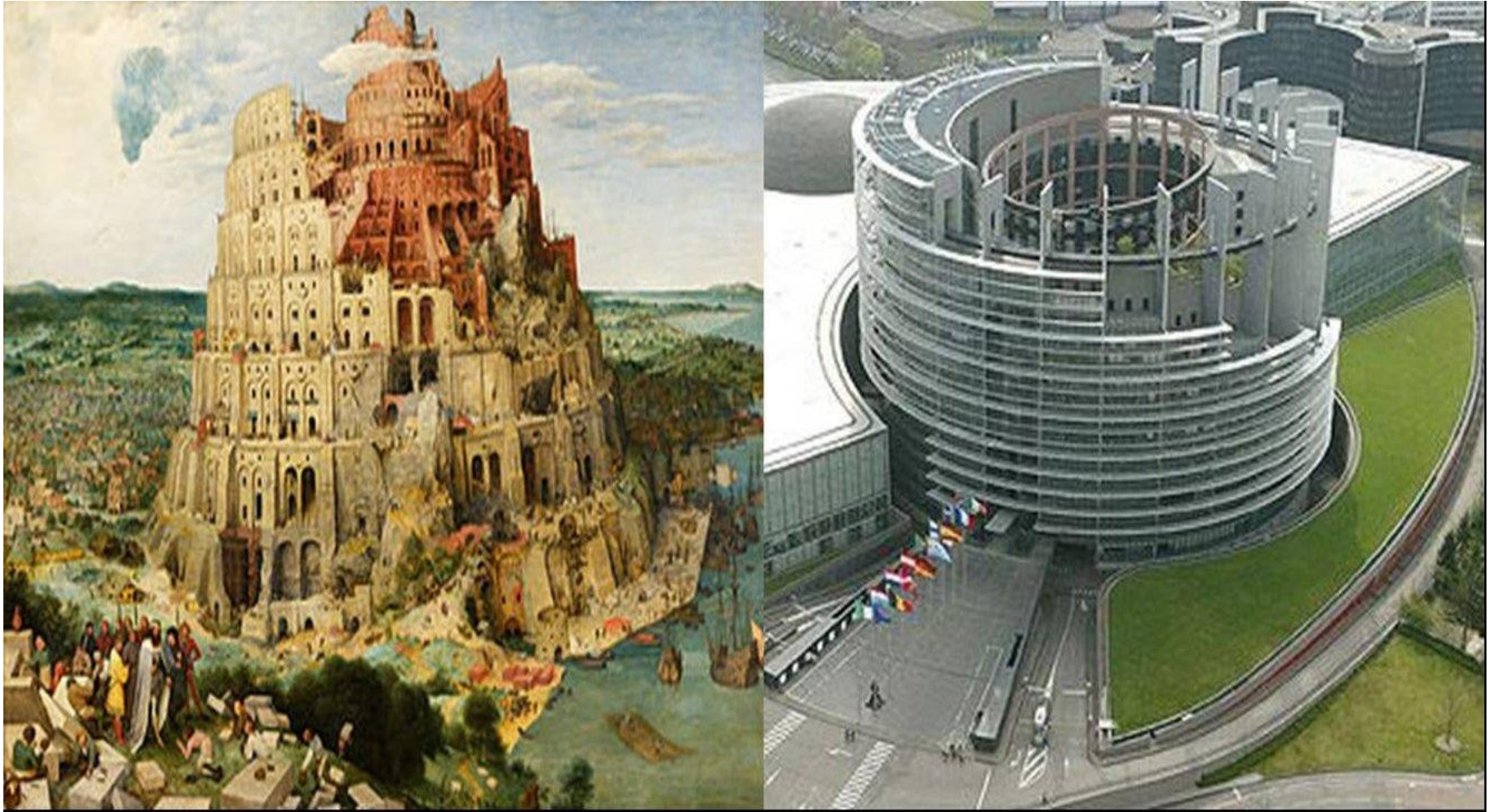

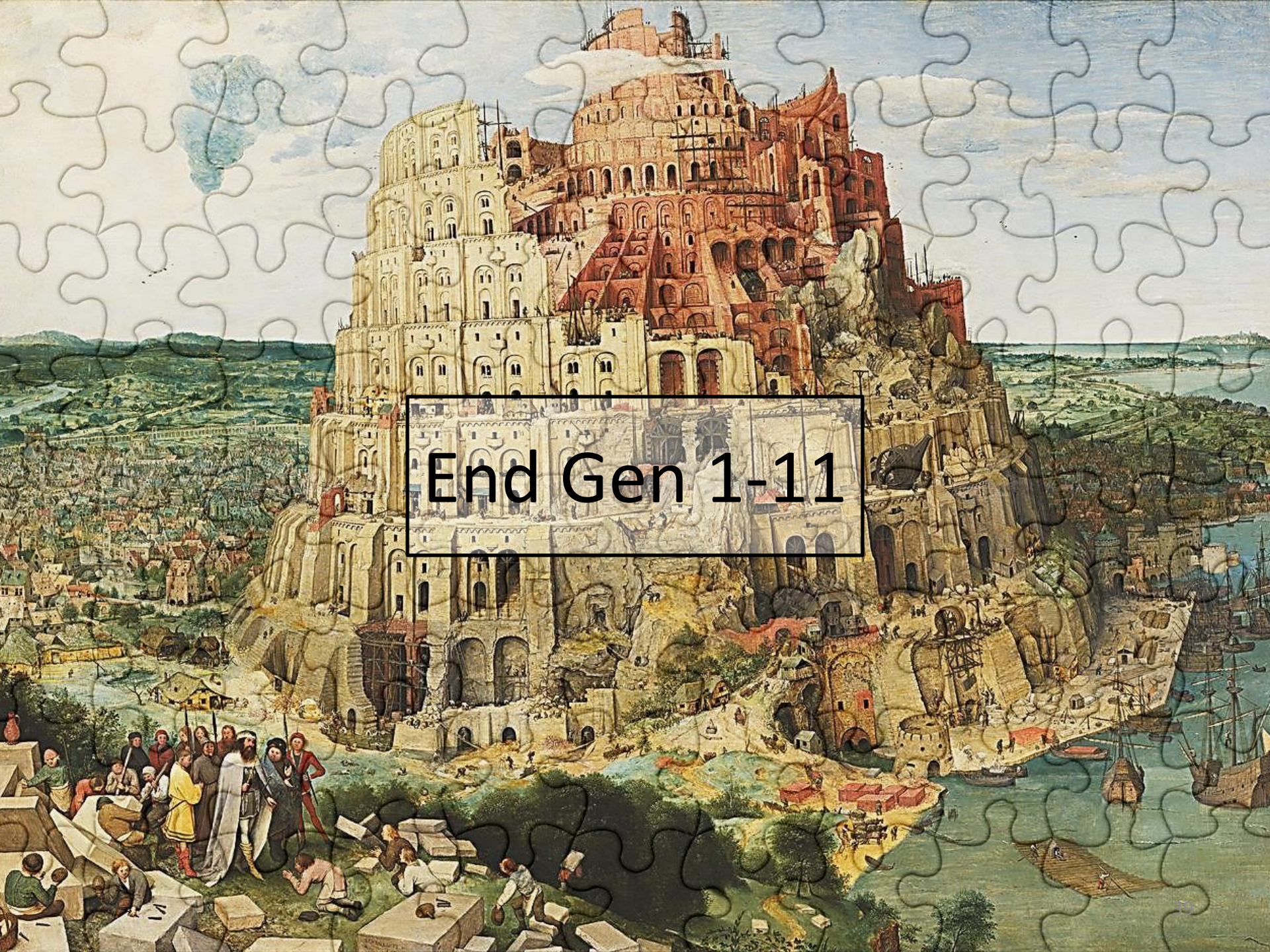
Tower of Babel

- Nimrod – 1st king mentioned in Bible, “rebel”, mighty hunter (of souls), lifter of the heavens – Gen 10 and 11
 - Type of the antichrist
 - Empire builder and one world government
 - Plain of Shinar – Babylon ([Rev 17.5](#) end times)
 - Wife, Semaramis – source of idolatrous traditions
 - Queen of heaven – [Jer 7:18; Jer 44:17-19,25](#)
 - [Christmas traditions](#): trees, yule log, 12/25 sun worship
 - Easter traditions: bunnies and eggs - fertility
 - Tammuz, son and also husband. Weeping for Tammuz. [Eze 8.14](#)
- One people and language, no restraint
 - Let us build a city, tower, and make a name
- God – “Let Us go down” and confound their language

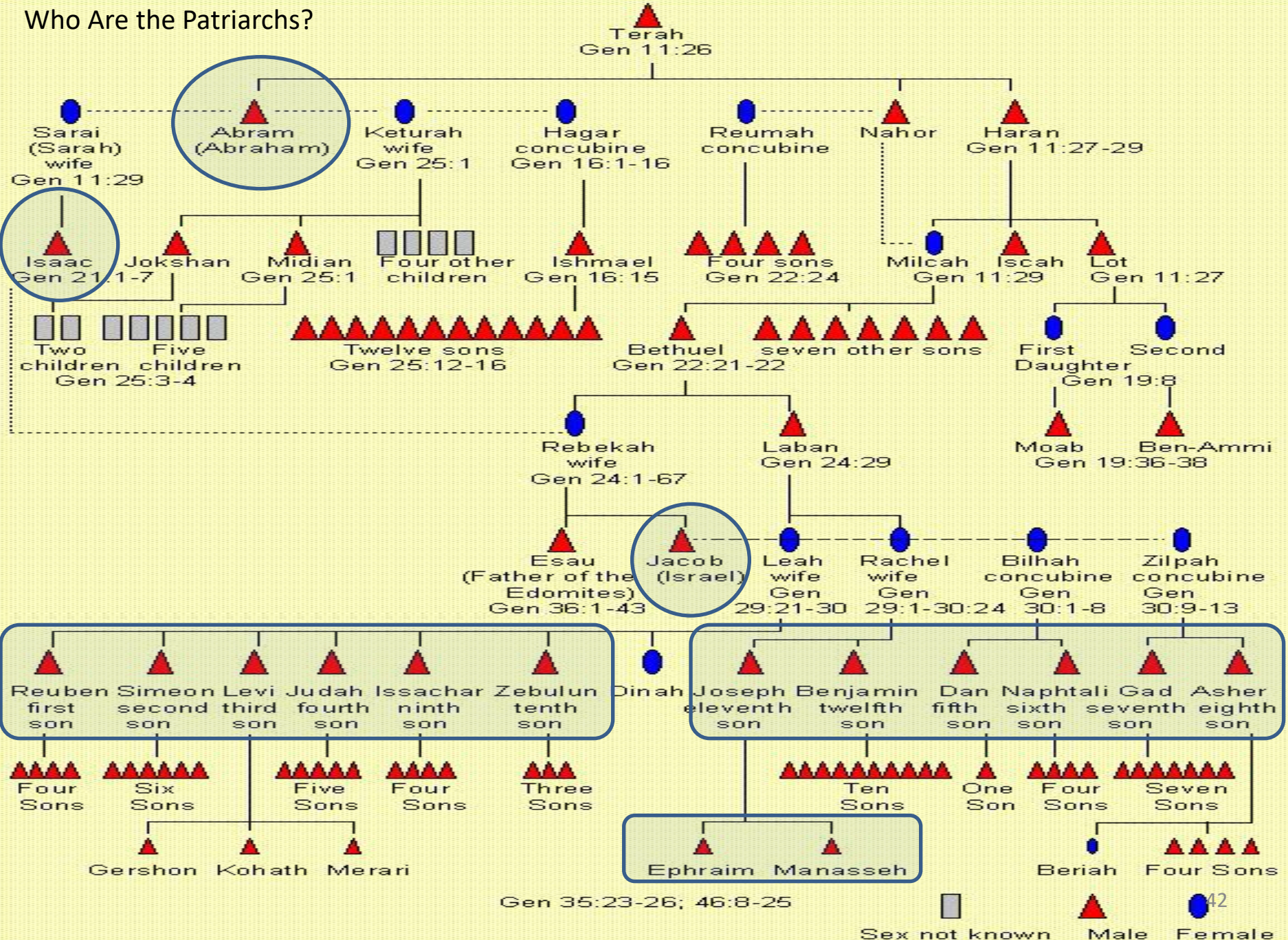

- God is frequently referred to as the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, or the God of our fathers
- Jews, Muslims, and Christians consider Abraham the patriarch of their religion

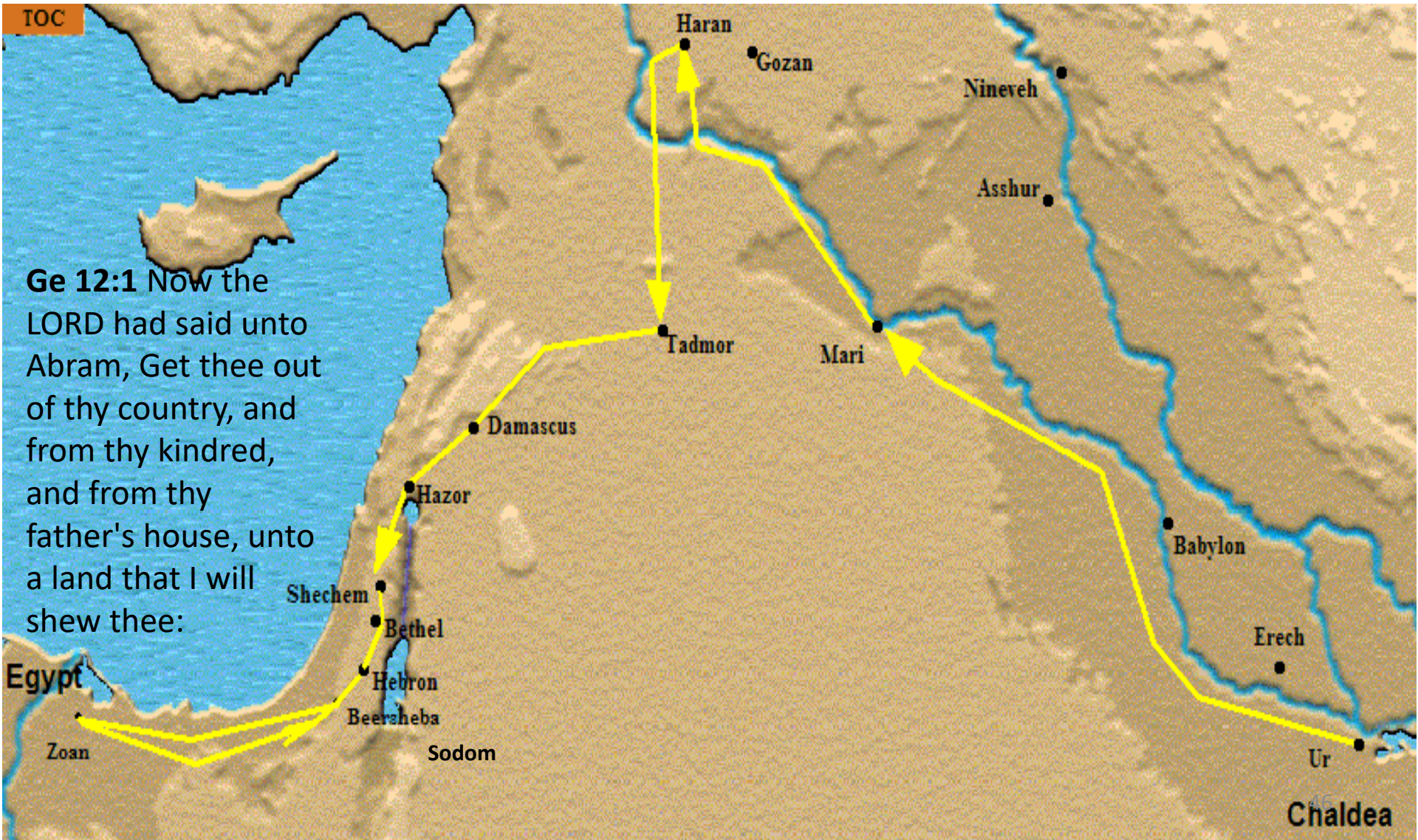

The 12 Tribes in the Land



Abraham

- Name changed – Abram (blessed father) -> Abraham (father of a multitude)
- Abraham “the Hebrew” in [Ge 14.13](#). In [Jer 34.9](#) Hebrew and Jew are interchangeable
- Met Melchisedec – King of righteousness, peace, & priest of the most high God – [Heb 7.1-3](#)
- Saw Jesus’ day – [Joh 8.56](#)
- Gospel preached to him – [Ga 3.8,16](#)
- Alive after death – [Lu 16.19-31](#)

Man of Faith, Friend of God, Father of All Who Believe

- Ga 3:9 ...they which be of faith are blessed with **faithful Abraham**.
- Heb 11:8 **By faith Abraham**...obeyed...
- Jas 2:23 **Abraham believed God**, and it was imputed unto him for righteousness: and he was called the **Friend of God**.
- Joh 8:56-59 Your **father Abraham** rejoiced to see my day: and he saw [it], and was glad ... Before Abraham was, **I am**. Then took they up stones to cast at him...
- Rom 4:11 ...**the father** of all them that believe...
- Ro 4:16 Therefore it is of faith, that it might be by grace; to the end the promise might be sure to all the seed; not to that only which is of the law, but to that also which is of the faith of Abraham; who is **the father of us all**

2. Famine in Canaan forces flight to Egypt ([12.10](#))
3. Abduction of Sarah in Egypt (my sister) ([12.15](#))
4. War with the four kings to rescue Lot ([14.14](#))
5. Marriage to Hagar ([16.3](#))
6. Commandment of circumcision age 99 ([17.24](#))
7. Abimelech's abduction of Sarah (my sister) ([20.2](#))
8. Having to drive Hagar away ([21.10,12](#))
9. Having to drive Ishmael away ([21.10,12](#))
10. The binding of Isaac on the altar ([22.2](#))

Isaac

- “Laughter” – [Ge 17.17,18.13](#) (Abraham & Sarah laughed at the prospect)
- Child of promise not bondage in [Ga 4:22](#) – “[thine only son](#)” in [Ge 22:2](#)
- Younger chosen over elder – [Ro 9.10 - 12](#) — Recurring theme —>
- Lies to Abimelech about Rebekah like Abraham
- Figure/type of Christ in many ways
 - Foretold and named before birth
 - Carried wood for sacrifice
 - Offered on Mt. Moriah
 - Raised up the 3rd day
 - Eliezer (helper of God) sent by Abraham to get a bride for Isaac
 - Rebekah comes by faith to the marriage with Isaac
- Covenant of land and seed confirmed with Isaac ([Ge 17.19](#))
- Twins born – Esau then Jacob
- Isaac not as prominent as Abraham or Jacob

Jacob

- Name – deceiver, supplanter, a deal maker
- Had trouble with faith until the end (He 11.21)
- Rebekah's favorite (Esau was Isaac's favorite)
- Buys the birthright then steals the blessing
- Deceived by Laban and later by his own sons
- Covenant confirmed regarding land and seed
- Wrestles with God – name changed to Israel

Joseph

- Savior of his family – figure of Christ
- Hated by the brothers
 - Jacob’s favorite – example of the coat
 - Different mothers
 - Had dreams (and told them)
 - Sheaves in the field make obeisance to his sheaf
 - Sun, moon, and 11 stars make obeisance
- Interpreter of dreams
 - Butler and baker
 - Pharaoh - kine & corn
- Tested
 - Sold into slavery – rose to trusted position with Potiphar
 - Tempted by Potiphar’s wife, lied about and imprisoned
 - Rises to trusted position with guards and inmates
- Wisdom – from the Spirit of God
 - [Ge 41.38](#)
- Interprets Pharaoh’s dream
 - Trusted by Pharaoh
 - Put in charge of everything
 - Like Daniel later in Babylon and Mordecai in Persia

Judah – Line of Christ

- [Ge 49.8-11](#) Jacob's prophecy regarding Judah
 - The **Lion** ([Re 5.5](#))
 - **Sceptre & Lawgiver** ([Nu 24.17, Heb 1.8](#)) shall not depart from Judah until **Shiloh** come to gather the people
 - The **Ass's colt** ([Zec 9.9, Mt 21.2-5](#))
 - **Choice Vine** ([Joh 15.5](#))
 - **Garments dipped in blood** ([Re 19.13](#))
- Sons of Judah - Er, Onan, Shelah
Pharez and Zerah by Tamar (his daughter in law)
- Tamar in the line of Christ like Rahab, Ruth, and Mary

New Testament on the Patriarchs

- Abraham mentioned in 70 verses, Isaac 18, Jacob 25
- In the genealogies of Matthew 1 and Luke 3
- Jesus' comments on Abraham
 - [Luke 16.19-31](#) to the Pharisees (Rich Man & Lazarus)
 - [Joh 8:37-44;56-59](#) Jews seek to kill Him for saying -
“**before Abraham was, I am**”
 - Referring to [Abraham, Isaac, Jacob](#) in the Gospels
- Stephen's sermon to Jewish leaders - [Ac 7](#)
- Paul on Abraham – faith and works
 - [Ro 4; Ga 3.6-9,14-18,29](#)
 - [Ga 4.22,28](#)
 - [Heb 11.8-22](#) (faith of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph)
- James [2.21-23](#) - faith and works of Abraham

Stephen Teaches the Big Picture to the Jewish Leaders [Acts 7.1-18](#)

- God of glory appeared to Abraham before Haran
- Get out of thy country and away from thy kindred, and I will shew thee a land
- Terah dies age 205, Abram is 75. He leaves Haran ([Ge 11.26](#))
- No inheritance, no child, but a promise
- Abraham is foretold of Egyptian bondage and exodus
- Covenant of circumcision (age 99)
- Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, 12 patriarchs
- For envy Joseph was sold, but he became head of Egypt
- Famine. Joseph revealed to his brethren
- Jacob and kin move to Egypt (75 souls – all his kindred)

Paul's Comments on Abraham

- Romans 4:3 For what saith the scripture? Abraham believed God, and it was counted unto him for righteousness.
- Romans 4:16 Therefore it is of faith, that it might be by grace; to the end the promise might be sure to all the seed; not to that only which is of the law, but to that also which is of the faith of Abraham; who is the father of us all,
- Romans 4:20 He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief; but was strong in faith, giving glory to God;
- Romans 4:21 And being fully persuaded that, what he had promised, he was able also to perform.
- Romans 4:24 But for us also, to whom it shall be imputed, if we believe on him that raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead;
- Romans 4:25 Who was delivered for our offences, and was raised again for our justification.
- Compare [Gal 3.6-29](#)

Hebrews 11 on Genesis

- Abraham obeyed call to go, not knowing where
 - He sojourned in a strange country
 - Looked for a city whose builder/maker was God
- Sarah conceived Isaac when past child bearing
- Abraham offered Isaac believing God's promise
- Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau concerning things to come
- Jacob when dying, blessed the sons of Joseph and worshipped
- Joseph gave commandment about his bones

James on Abraham - Faith and Works

- Jas 2:21 Was not Abraham our father justified by works, when he had offered Isaac his son upon the altar? **NO!**
- Jas 2:22 Seest thou how faith wrought with his works, and by works was faith made perfect?
- Jas 2:23 And the scripture was fulfilled which saith, Abraham believed God, and it was imputed unto him for righteousness: and he was called the Friend of God.
